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I. Introduction.

- A. Text: II Corinthians 6:3-13.
- B. The key to this passage is the commendation Paul gives as servants of God—he is talking about commending himself to non-Christians by deeds.

II. Marks of the ministry.

A. Endurance.

- 1. The nature of endurance.
 - a. In affliction, in hardships, in calamities.
 - b. In beatings, in imprisonments, and in tumults.
 - c. In labors, in watching, and in hunger. (Acts 13)
- 2. The process of endurance.
 - a. Purity, knowledge, forbearance, and kindness.
 - 1) One cannot control his thoughts, but he can prevent them from nesting.
 - 2) Knowledge means getting into God's Word.
 - 3) Forbearance is putting up with people and not getting upset when not everything goes right.
 - 4) Kindness is an understanding gracious touch.
 - b. The Holy Spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God. Without the Spirit, we would not have genuine love, truthful speech and the power of God.
 - c. The weapons of righteousness: the right hand and the left, in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute.
 - 1) The private life is just as much a testimony as the public life in the grace of God.
 - 2) The Lord Himself is the judge of man.

- B. The test of a Christian is whether people speak about him as a paradox. We must be content to be considered an imposter by some, unknown by others, rich by some, poor by others, etc. and live and rejoice in this way.
- C. The great appeal to Christians today ought to be that they are restricted but by love.
