A. A garden that is let go grows weeds.

B. Christ must be active in the garden of the church for it to be healthy.

V. The Garden of heaven where the glory of God is manifest. (Revelation 21-22)

A. We are looking forward to a future city.

B. The curse of Genesis will be completely reversed as Revelation 21-22 tells us.
