  - A. All who have not entrusted Christ as savior are indwelt by the spirit of disobedience. (Ephesians 2)

  - C. Mary Magdalene was redeemed from this power.
  - D. After Mary was redeemed, she ministered to Jesus out of her means.
- III. Salome, Mary's sister: it is a place of rebuke.
  - A. Salome prayed a selfish prayer that her sons would be put on thrones.
  - B. She misunderstood because Jesus reigned through the cross.
- IV. Mary, the mother of Jesus: it is a place of great reward.
  - A. Mary could have gotten Jesus off the cross by saying that what he was saying was not true.
  - B. However, she believed Jesus was the Messiah, so she remained silent.
  - C. Jesus gave Mary his closest disciple to love her. People who love us are the second greatest gift next to salvation.
- V. The cross is a responsibility to us.
  - A. We take Jesus' place on his earth.
  - B. Many do not know the meaning of responsibility.
  - C. Responsibility is our response to God's ability.
  - D. We get near the cross by reaching out in faith.
