C. God is at peace as to his will. (Jeremiah 29:11)
D. Peace is to be proclaimed.

2. Before God declares war, he always declares peace. (Luke 2)
3. Our ministry is one of reconciliation. (Luke 19:41, 2 Corinthians 5)
III. The enemy of peace is sin.
A. Wherever there is sin there is war. (James 4)
4. Christians are at war with each other because they are at war with themselves.
5. People are at war with themselves because they are at war with God in pride. (Isaiah 32:17)
IV. The minister of peace is the Christian.
A. It is hard to pray for more understanding when someone is difficult.
B. Unless we have God's nature, we cannot be a peacemaker.
C. The first peacemaking we have to do is with our brothers and sisters in Christ. (Matthew 25:1; 18)
D. We must love our enemies also.
V. The blessing of peace is becoming more like God.
