II. We should know God because it is his desire. (Habakkuk 1:13; Hosea 6:6; 1 Corinthians 1:9; Philippians 3:10; Psalm 27:4; Exodus 33:13; Psalm 119:55)

- A. Result of knowing God: to know God is to love him. (Genesis 5:21-24; Hebrews 11:5)
- B. To know God....
 - 1. Be converted. (2 Corinthians 13:5)
 - 2. Know his Word. (John 5:39)
 - 3. Spend time with God in fellowship.
 - 4. Watch the example of godly people. (Acts 27)
 - 5. Experience the inward journey through meditation and waiting on the Lord.

III. We should love God.

A. Jesus commanded it. (Matthew 22:34)

B. Loving God is a matter of choice. The emotions are subject to the will. (Deuteronomy 30:19-28; 5:29)

C. We disobey God because we believe that God does not have our best interests at heart, but he does. (Jeremiah 29:11)

D. We disobey God because we believe that God does not know what is best for us, but he does. (Ephesians 1:8)

E. We disobey God because of bitterness, but this poisons us.

F. Prosperity keeps us from obeying God. (Proverbs 20:8-9)

G. Self-seeking keeps us from obeying God. (Jeremiah 45:5)

IV. We should glorify God. (Revelation 4:11)

A. We glorify God because it is the purpose for which we were created. (Isaiah 43:7; Revelation 4:11)

B. We glorify God by doing everything for the glory of God. (1 Corinthians 10:31; Matthew 6:33)

C. We glorify God by bearing fruit. (John 15:5)

D. We glorify God by praising him. (Psalm 50:23)

E. We glorify God by confessing Jesus as Lord. (Philippians 2:11)

V. To be used of him.

- A. Only God produces fruit. (Psalm 127:1; John 15:5; 6:63; Romans 7; Philippians 3:3)
- B. To be used we must be fit to use. (2 Timothy 2:19; 3:17)
- C. God is most interested in our character. (Ephesians 1:12)

VI. To raise up.

A. God sends forth laborers, and it is our object to pray. (Matthew 29)

B. A laborer is trained and equipped to do what God wants him to do.

C. God wants us to invest in a few other men to build spiritual generations. (Isaiah 58:12; Psalm 56:13)
